Elective Delivery Quality Collaborative

This partnership between HCA, the West Virginia Perinatal Partnership and the March of Dimes is working to reduce the frequency of pre-term (39 weeks or less) elective births in the absence of medical risk factors. Teams from 15 hospitals around the state, working with state and private payers, are developing the best practices. The goal is to have better outcomes for moms and babies as well as to reduce the number of extended hospital stays and NICU admissions.



Rural Health Systems Program

Co-managed with the Office of Community Health Systems, the Rural Health program provides grants or loans to rural care facilities or organizations that meet designated guidelines. The program's goal is the avoidance of potential crisis or collapse of essential rural health care services.

In FY 2008, the Rural Health Systems Program supported the installation of electronic medical records (EMR) in several primary care clinics. EMR systems enhance patient care and offer cost savings as well as keeping rural clinics technologically up to date. Grant awards totaled \$1,152,015.00 for FY 2007-2008.

West Virginia Health Information Network

The West Virginia Health Information Network is charged with building and maintaining a private and secure electronic highway for the exchange of medical data. The WVHIN will begin its first level of services in 2009. Patients, physicians and other health care providers will reap significant benefits through the WVHIN, including improved patient care facilitated by having the right medical information available at the time and place needed for making care decisions. Eventually, the WVHIN will be part of the "national network of networks" that will enable the secure exchange of patient data among states, whenever and wherever needed. 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Executive Summary

Hospitals:

Overall, West Virginia hospitals remained relatively stable, reporting profits of \$184.5 million or 4.4% of net patient revenue (NPR), up from \$176.7 million (4.5% of NPR) in FY 2006.

Acute Care Hospitals

The total profit margin for the 35 general acute care hospitals increased by almost 1%, with profits of \$165.7 million (4.4% of NPR), up from \$123.8 million (3.5% of NPR) in the prior year.

Critical Access Hospitals (CAH)

As a group, the profitability for CAHs continued to improve for the fourth straight year. The aggregate profit was \$5.8 million (2.3% of NPR). In FY 2006, profit was \$4.3 million (1.8% of NPR).

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals (LTCH)

The two facilities in FY 2007 reported a profit of \$1.5 million (5.9% of NPR), a decline from the FY 2006 profit of \$3.3 million (12.4% of NPR).

Psychiatric Hospitals

The psychiatric hospitals had an aggregate loss of \$8.3 million (35.8% of NPR), with the two state psychiatric hospitals losing \$9.6 million combined and the two private hospitals earning profits of \$1.3 million. The prior year's overall loss was \$702,000 (2.0% of NPR).

Rehabilitation Hospitals

The five rehabilitation hospitals showed a return to more normal profit levels with aggregate profits of \$19.8 million (22.1% of NPR). In FY 2006, these hospitals reported an aggregate profit of \$46.0 million (51.7% of NPR) due to the sale of a facility.

Other Facilities:

Nursing Homes

The overall profit margin for the state's 106 nursing homes increased by 1.5%. Aggregate profits of \$44.8 million (6.5% of NPR) were reported, an increase over the \$32.6 million (5.0% of NPR) reported in FY 2006.

Aggregate net patient revenue increased \$38.6 million in FY 2007; expenses increased \$25.1 million.

Home Health

Overall, home health agencies reported total losses of \$2.3 million on \$84.1 million total revenue; 32 of the 66 agencies were profitable.

Eleven home health agencies were acquired during FY 2007.

Hospice

Hospice profits for the 19 agencies were \$8.3 million, compared to \$9.1 million in FY 2006.

Behavioral Health Facilities

Eighty-nine behavioral health providers reported aggregate profits of \$15.1 million, 2.9% of total revenue; 57 of 89 facilities were profitable.

Methadone Treatment Facilities

The aggregate profit for the eight facilities was \$6.1 million, 29.7% of total revenue.

Ambulatory Surgical Centers (ASC)

Eleven reporting certified ASCs had an aggregate profit of \$5.2 million, 21.7% of total revenue.

Overview

The West Virginia Health Care Authority (Authority) collects and disseminates financial data on health care facilities, including hospitals, nursing homes, home health agencies, hospice agencies, behavioral health centers and ambulatory surgical centers. The reporting period is the facility fiscal year which ended during the calendar year. Therefore, the data are reflective of a time span rather than of one point in time, and should be interpreted as such. The data are presented here as reported by the facilities. While the manner and type of

information submitted varies with the type of facility, efforts have been made to produce reasonable comparisons. Where the number of facilities has changed since the previous year, a "same-facilities" comparison is often used.

This report includes data from some 364 facilities providing services to West Virginia residents in FY 2007.



Revenue

The facilities included in this report had aggregate revenue of \$5.9 billion from patient services, and other operating and non-operating revenue, which was an increase of \$320 million (5.7%) over FY 2006. General acute care hospitals accounted for \$247 million (77%) of the growth in revenue. Behavioral health centers and nursing homes provided another \$55.6 million (17%) and \$37.1 million (12%), respectively, of the total increase in revenue. Rehabilitation hospitals experienced, the only significant decline, \$31.6 million (9.9%). This was due to an unusual increase in the prior year due to the sale of a hospital facility. FY 2007 saw a return to more normal revenue levels for this sector.



Hospital revenue made up more than 75% of total provider revenues, followed by nursing homes with nearly 12%, and behavioral health centers with just over 9%. The home health and hospice sectors each accounted for 1.4% of total revenues and ambulatory surgery centers only 0.4%.




Net patient revenue (NPR), the amount received for patient services, is also reported by payor categories for hospitals and nursing homes. For hospitals, in FY 2007, nongovernmental payors (commercial, Blue-Cross, Carelink, unions, ERISAs, self-pay) provided the largest amount of revenue of \$1.7 billion, closely followed by Medicare of \$1.6 billion. State payors (Medicaid, PEIA) and other government payors (VA, Worker's Comp, etc.) combined provided revenue of \$853 million. For nursing homes Medicare and Medicaid revenue equaled \$150 million and \$447 million, respectively. Other payor revenue combined was \$89 million.

Nursing Home Net Patient Revenue by Payor Class




EROE

Aggregate profits for all facilities were \$262 million, up 14% over FY 2006. The term profit (loss) is used here interchangeably with excess (deficit) of revenue before taxes and extraordinary items (EROE), and is applied to all facilities, including not-for-profits. Hospitals, nursing homes, hospice agencies and behavioral health centers had increased profits. Ambulatory surgery centers' profit remained stable, while home health agencies decreased their losses.

Together, the reported revenue from hospitals and nursing homes equaled 87.4% of the total revenue and 87.6% of the total profit.

Utilization


Hospital inpatient utilization showed little fluctuation for several years, but over the past two years total inpatient discharges have decreased 6,223 (2.1%). In FY 2006 there was a decrease of 5,072 (1.7%) in total discharges from the prior year and for FY 2007 total discharges dropped another 1,151 (0.4%). The two-year decline in Medicare discharges of 5,063 (3.4%) accounts for 81.4% of the total decline.

Discharges covered by nongovernment payors account for 26.0% of total discharges, and 41.0% of revenue. The remaining 74.0% of discharges are covered by government payors, and generate 59.0% of revenue.

Utilization of hospital outpatient services continues to grow, although inpatient revenues remain as the larger share of the total revenue. There were more than 6.2 million outpatient visits in FY 2007, an increase of 1.6%. However, over two years outpatient visits have risen by 331,000 (5.6%). The payor mix is substantially different for outpatient services compared to inpatient services. Whereas Medicare dominates the inpatient utilization, the nongovernmental payor class is the largest category with 41.9% of visits, followed by Medicare with 33.3%, and Medicaid with 15.1%.



Hospital Visits by Payor Class*



Nursing home utilization remains stable, but experienced a slight decrease of 1.1% in total patient days between FY 2006 and FY 2007. Governmental programs pay for the vast majority of nursing home services, where Medicare and Medicaid provide 86.5% of patient days. Medicaid, with 2.4 million inpatient days (74.1%), is by far the largest payor followed by Medicare with 12.4%. Medicare covers only skilled nursing services.

Nursing homes may offer some outpatient services, such as physical therapy to discharged patients, but utilization is minimal.

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Hospitals

In aggregate, West Virginia's 64 hospitals reported an increase in financial status in FY 2007. Profit (loss) is used here to mean excess (deficit) of revenue over expenses (EROE) prior to taxes and any extraordinary gains or losses. It is used for not-for-profit as well as for-profit hospitals.

The profit for all hospitals was \$184.5 million, or 4.4% of net patient revenue (NPR). This continued the upswing in profits that began in FY 2006, albeit at a slower pace, when hospitals reported profits of \$176.7 million (4.5% of NPR). Detailed information on aggregate and individual hospital income as well as utilization is shown in Tables 6-19.

During FY 2007 the status of operations changed with several hospitals:

- St. Francis Hospital, which was sold by HCA to LifePoint Hospitals in FY 2006, was sold again to Thomas Health Systems, LLC, on January 1, 2007, changing it from a for-profit hospital to a not-for-profit.
- On May 1, 2007, St. Luke's Hospital in Bluefield was closed. St. Luke's Hospital was owned by Princeton Community Hospital. Since St. Luke's fiscal year ended on June 30, the data included within the report is for ten months.
- Eye & Ear Clinic changed its name and is now doing business as Charleston Surgical Hospital. The information included within the 2008 Annual Report, makes use of the updated name.

Because of the closure of three hospitals, Guyan Valley and WV Rehabilitation Center (in FY 2006), and Richwood (in FY 2008), same-facilities comparisons are made in total and for those categories when comparing data with prior years. Unless otherwise indicated, this narrative uses the same-facilities comparisons.

General Acute Care Hospitals

These hospitals provide primarily short-stay medical-surgical services, although they may include units providing a wide range of other services. There were 35 general acute care hospitals in FY 2007. Profits from acute care hospitals were up \$41.9 million,

increasing from \$123.8 million (3.5% of NPR), in FY 2006 to \$165.7 million (4.4% of NPR) in FY 2007. The higher profitability in FY 2007 resulted from a \$36.6 million increase in other revenue, and a decrease in the loss on patient services of \$5.3 million. Sixty percent (\$22 million) of the growth in other revenue came from an increase in investment income from two hospitals, WVU (\$14.4 million) and Monongalia General (\$7.5 million). Uncompensated care increased from 6.3% of gross patient revenue (GPR) in FY 2006 to 6.4% of GPR in FY 2007. Uncompensated care as a percentage of gross patient revenue has risen slowly (0.9%) over the last five years.

Twenty-seven of the 35 acute care hospitals reported a profit. Gains ranged from OVMC's \$25,000 (0.03% of NPR) to WVU Hospitals' \$50.0 million (10.8% of NPR). Losses ranged from CAMC Teays Valley's \$376,000 (0.9% of NPR) to St. Luke's \$5.6 million (37.0% of NPR).

In FY 2007, six hospitals had margins (profit as a percent of NPR) of 10% or higher. These were, in descending order, Charleston Surgical Hospital (26.1%), Stonewall Jackson (17.0%), Greenbrier Valley (12.4%), Williamson (12.2%), WVU (10.8%), and Princeton (10.0%). In FY 2006, only three hospitals had margins greater than 10%. Seven hospitals had margins between 5% and 10%, down one from FY 2006. The state's largest hospital, CAMC, had a margin of 0.4%. CAMC recorded a \$26 million dollar litigation judgment within its operating expenses for FY 2007, thereby reducing its profit by that amount. During 2008, the award was reduced to \$11 million. The impact of this to CAMC may be further reduced if a settlement is reached with the hospital's insurance company.

Overall losses on patient services continued, but improved slightly from the prior year. For FY 2007, aggregate losses of \$52.5 million (1.4% of NPR) were reported compared to \$57.8 million (1.6% of NPR) in FY 2006. Twenty-one hospitals reported losses on patient services ranging from \$898,000 (0.5% of NPR) at Wheeling to \$35.3 million (5.9% of NPR) at CAMC. This loss includes the \$26 million judgment, without this the losses on patient services would have been \$9.3 million (1.5% of NPR). The largest percentage loss on patient services was 36.2% of NPR (\$5.5 million) at St. Luke's. Fourteen hospitals reported profits on patient services ranging from \$60,000 (0.1% of NPR) at Bluefield Regional to \$7.5 million (11.9% of NPR) at Greenbrier Valley.

The reduction in losses on patient services was accompanied by an increase in other revenue. Other revenues consist of other non-patient operating revenue and non-operating revenues. Twelve hospitals reported an increase in other revenue in excess of \$1 million for FY 2007. WVU had the largest increase of \$15.9 million, followed by Monongalia General with an \$8.4 million increase. These increases were almost entirely due to increases in investment income as discussed above. Four hospitals had decreases in other revenue of more than \$1 million. Thirteen hospitals, with losses on patient services, reported profits solely because of other revenues. In FY 2006, there were ten hospitals where this occurred.

Overall, acute care expenses equaled \$3.8 billion in FY 2007; an increase of 5.7% over FY 2006. This is a step up from FY 2006 when the increase in expenses was 4.5%. For FY 2005 and FY 2004, expenses increased 4.6% and 8.0%, respectively. For acute care hospitals, employee compensation and benefits increased 2.5% from FY 2006. This is the largest component of total operating expenses (48.8%).

Critical Access Hospitals

Critical Access is a Medicare designation for reimbursing small community hospitals for the provision of limited acute care services in combination with swing-bed and skilled nursing care. In FY 2007, 17 of the 18 operating critical access hospitals reported, and the financial performance results were mixed. Richwood Community Medical Center, which closed in June 2008, did not submit a Uniform Financial Report for FY 2007. Eleven critical access hospitals reported profits in FY 2007, down from 12 in FY 2006. Total profit for FY 2007 was \$5.8 million (2.3% of NPR) up from \$4.3 million (1.8% of NPR) in FY 2006. Typically, critical access hospitals have small margins; however, three hospitals earned more than \$1 million in FY 2007, Plateau Medical (\$1.8 million), Jefferson (\$1.6 million), and Morgan County War (\$1.1 million), accounting for 76.5% of the total profit. In the history of the critical access hospital program in West Virginia there has never been more than one hospital that earned more than \$1 million in a year.

Six hospitals reported income from patient services, ranging from Hampshire's \$48,000 (0.5% of NPR) to Plateau Medical's \$1.7 million (8.2% of NPR). Losses on patient services ranged from Preston's \$109,000 (0.7% of NPR) to Minnie Hamilton's \$1.5 million (13.4% of NPR). Six hospitals were noted last year as experiencing consecutive losses. Of these, one closed in 2006, another closed in 2008, one continues to experience a loss, but

is associated with a supporting Health System, and three report profits in FY 2007.

Despite a decline in aggregate inpatient utilization of 4.1%, as measured by total discharges, net patient revenue increased \$13.3 million (5.5%). This slightly outpaced an increase in operating expenses of \$12.7 million (5.2%) for FY 2007. Yet, challenges remain for critical access hospitals. These facilities have experienced the same pressures as general acute care facilities to address manpower shortages while maintaining cost controls.

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals (LTCH) are generally defined as hospitals with an average Medicare inpatient length of stay greater than 25 days. These facilities provide extended care including comprehensive rehabilitation, respiratory therapy, head trauma treatment and pain management. Two LTCHs operated in West Virginia in FY 2007. Both facilities are for-profit and privately owned. Select Specialty began providing services during 2001. Originally located within CAMC, Select Specialty moved to St. Francis Hospital during FY 2007. Cornerstone Hospital of Huntington opened in March 2005 and is located within St. Mary's Hospital. For FY 2007, Cornerstone reported a profit of \$1.2 million (10.4% of NPR). All but \$34,000 of the profit came from patient services. Select Specialty reported a profit of \$252,000 (1.9% of NPR), with a loss of \$66,000 on patient services. In FY 2006, Select Specialty reported a profit of \$1.5 million (10.2% of NPR). The decline in profits accompanies a decline in net patient revenue of \$1.5 million, and a decrease in discharges of 5.5% (23 discharges). Select Specialty also experienced significant swings in profitability in prior years which was attributed, in part, to fluctuating levels of management fees charged by the parent corporation. In FY 2007, Cornerstone's discharges increased 3.5% (10 discharges).

Psychiatric Hospitals

Two private and two state hospitals operate as free-standing psychiatric hospitals in West Virginia. While both the private and state hospitals treat psychiatric patients, they operate very differently. For the most part, private hospitals admit voluntary patients, while state-operated hospitals generally do not.

The two state hospitals reported \$9.6 million in combined losses resulting in an overall loss of \$8.3 million for the psychiatric facilities as a sector. This was a sharp decline in profitability from the prior year's loss of \$702,000. In FY 2005, a loss of \$5.2 million

was reported. Mildred Bateman, one of the two state hospitals, reported a loss of \$3.0 million. Sharpe, the other state facility, reported a loss of \$6.6 million. The two state hospitals reported combined deficits of \$64.0 million for patient services. These operating losses were reduced substantially because of state apportionments. The state hospitals operate at full capacity with extremely high levels of uncompensated care.

Of the two private hospitals, River Park reported a profit of \$1.0 million (5.9% of NPR) and Highland reported a profit of \$247,000 (2.8% of NPR). Only River Park, a for-profit facility has consistently reported profits on patient services for the last seven fiscal years. Highland's occupancy rate (40.1%) was the lowest of all four psychiatric hospitals. River Park reported an occupancy rate of 64.2%. Total licensed beds for the four psychiatric facilities equaled 485,

almost equally divided between private and state hospitals.

Rehabilitation Hospitals

In FY 2007, five rehabilitation hospitals operated in West Virginia. All five hospitals are for-profit facilities, and four are owned and operated by Health South, Inc. The remaining facility, Peterson Rehabilitation and Geriatric Center, is owned and operated by Guardian Eldercare.

For FY 2007, the rehabilitation hospitals reported an overall profit of \$19.8 million (22.1% of NPR). This is a decrease in profit of \$26.2 million from FY 2006, when Peterson reported other revenue of \$22.5 million due to a gain on the sale of real estate and related assets. Without the significant gain recorded in FY 2006 the FY 2007 decrease in profitability is reduced to \$3.7 million.



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Nursing Homes

The FY 2007 Annual Report of Nursing Homes included information from each of the 106 long-term care facilities operating in the state. Data are provided as reported by each facility. In 2007, eighty-five for-profit facilities operated in the state. Several of the larger corporate entities included:

- The Carlyle Group (7), which purchased the HCR Manor Care facilities in December 2007;
- Diversicare Management Services (2);
- Genesis Eldercare (25);
- Golden Ventures (3);
- Integrated Commercial Enterprises (11); and,
- Sun Health Group (7).

Four facilities were sold during FY 2007:

- Care Haven of Pleasants was purchased by Pleasants – Carehaven Operating LLC in July 2007;
- Hidden Valley Health Care Center and Marmet Health Care Center were purchased by Genesis Elder Care in December 2006; and,
- Willow Tree Manor (formerly known as Blue Ridge Nursing and Rehabilitation Center) was purchased by Blue Ridge Nursing LLC in August 2007.

Four of the 106 long term care facilities are state operated and include Hopemont, John Manchin Sr. Health Care Center, Lakin and Pinecrest Hospital.

Net Patient Revenue (NPR) increases outpaced operating expense increases in FY 2007 by \$13.5 million. This is a reversal from FY 2006 when the increase in net patient revenues fell below the increase in operating expenses by \$4.3 million. For FY 2007, net patient revenue increased by \$38.6 million (6.0%) and expenses increased \$25.1 million (4.1%). The result was an increase in income from patient services of \$13.5 million compared to a decrease of \$4.3 million in FY 2006. Factors contributing to the improvement include a 5.2% increase in Medicaid net patient revenue. Medicaid net patient revenue

daily rates increased for ninety-three of the 104 providers. These changes resulted in total profits of \$44.8 million (6.5% of NPR), an increase of \$12.3 million over FY 2006.

The number of profitable facilities grew from 85 to 88 in FY 2007. Marmet Health Care Center experienced the largest EROE, \$1.7 million in FY 2007 compared to an approximate \$1.1 million profit in FY 2006. Dawnview Center had the second largest EROE, with \$1.6 million. For FY 2006 it reported a profit of \$1.5 million. One of the state operated facilities, Pinecrest Hospital experienced the largest negative EROE. For both FY 2007 and FY 2006, Pinecrest reported losses of \$4.3 million. Woodlands Retirement Community reported the second largest negative EROE, \$1.7 million, a decline from a loss of \$1.5 million in FY 2006. Two of the three remaining state operated facilities continued to record negative EROE's for FY 2007, while Lakin reported a positive EROE for the second consecutive year.

Eight facilities with negative EROEs in FY 2006 showed positive EROEs in FY 2007. Seventy-six facilities (71.7%) recorded positive EROEs all three years and 11 facilities (10.4%) reported losses all three years.

Of the 96 facilities that reported Medicare patient services, 90 (93.8%) showed a profit. Of the 104 facilities with Medicaid patients, 72 (69.2%) reported profit on those services. Aggregate income from patient services for Medicare and Medicaid was \$28.7 million and \$15.2 million, respectively. As a percent of NPR, the margins for Medicare and Medicaid were 19.2% and 3.4%, respectively.

Utilization of 3.3 million days was reported for FY 2007. This is a slight decrease (1.1%) from the prior year. Utilization has held steady around 3.3 million days since the late 1990s. Medicare and Medicaid accounted for 12.4% and 74.1%, respectively of total days.



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Home Health

The FY 2007 Survey of Home Health agencies was completed by 63 of the 66 home health agencies that serve West Virginia residents, including those based in Kentucky, Maryland and Ohio. The data are provided as reported by the facilities. Overall, home health agencies reported losses of \$2.3 million, 2.8% of \$84.5 million in total revenue, although 32 of the 66 agencies were profitable. FY 2007 is the fifth consecutive year for aggregate losses. In FY 2006, losses were \$4.3 million (5.1% of total revenue). In FY 2005, losses were \$919,000 (1.1% of total revenue). In FY 2004, losses were \$1.5 million (1.7% of total revenue), and in FY 2003, losses were \$547,000 (0.7% of total revenue).

Analysis of home health agencies by type of ownership shows mixed results. The agencies are subdivided by the following ownership categories: county-owned, proprietary and non-profit. Hospital-based agencies are discussed separately from other agencies, as the structure is significantly different and they historically experience the greatest losses.

There were a number of ownership changes during FY 2007:

- Amedisys, West Virginia acquired Extend-A-Care and Servcare;
- Nursing Care Home Health was purchased by Harden Healthcare; and,
- Mountaineer Home Health purchased Special Touch Nursing Services.

These agencies remain in the proprietary category after the change in ownership. Additionally, there were purchases that resulted in a change of ownership categories:

- The LHC Group, a publicly traded company, acquired non-profit hospital-based home health agencies from Boone Memorial, Camden-Clark, Princeton Community, Roane General, St. Mary's and Wetzel County.
- Northern West Virginia Home Health consolidated three hospital-based home health agencies: Hampshire Memorial Hospital Home Health, Potomac Valley Hos-

pital Home Health and Morgan County War Memorial Hospital Home Health. Of the three agencies only Morgan County War Memorial was non-profit.

Acquisitions of home health agencies have continued in FY 2008 and will be discussed in the 2009 Annual Report.

The nine county-owned agencies reported total losses of \$366,000, 8% of \$4.5 million in total revenue. This followed losses of \$1.3 million in FY 2006, and \$226,000 in FY 2005. Two of the nine county-owned agencies reported profits for FY 2007.

Total profit reported by the proprietary agencies decreased to \$3.5 million (8% of total revenue) from \$5.1 million (12% of total revenue) in FY 2006. Of the 28 proprietary agencies, 17 reported profits. Five non-profit home health agencies were operating in FY 2007. Two non-profit home health agencies reported combined losses of \$157,000 with total revenue of \$3.7 million. Three non-profit home health agencies were profitable, with a combined EROE of \$147,000, 21.7% of \$680,000 in total revenue. The five non-profit agencies reported a combined loss of \$10,000 on total revenue of \$4.3 million.

Non-profit hospital-based agencies continued to lose money in FY 2007. Of the remaining agencies not affected by acquisitions, the number of agencies losing money outnumbered profitable agencies 11 to 9. Total losses for the year in this segment were \$5.5 million; not counting the agencies involved in the acquisitions losses for that segment were only \$2.7 million. In FY 2006, the losses were \$7.6 million.

Only one proprietary hospital-based agency remains after the Northern West Virginia consolidations. Three Rivers Home Care, which is based in Kentucky, reported a profit for FY 2007 of \$67,000 (19% of total revenue).



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Hospice

The Health Care Authority collected data from 19 West Virginia hospice organizations using the Annual Hospice Survey.


In FY 2007, total hospice profit was \$8.3 million, or 10.6% of net patient revenue (NPR), a decrease from \$9.1 million (13.7% of NPR), in FY 2006. Total revenue was \$83.8 million, an increase of \$11.6 million (16.1%) from FY 2006. Utilization of hospice services increased in FY 2007. The number of patients served increased significantly (26%) and total patient days increased 7.8%. Expenses increased \$12.4 million (19.7%) from \$63 million in FY 2006 to \$75.5 million in FY 2007. Income from patient services decreased slightly to \$3.4 million from \$3.5 million. Other and non-operating revenues were \$4.9 million down from \$5.7 million in 2006.

Non-operating revenues include contributions from fund-raising campaigns and other donations.

Of the 19 agencies reporting, six reported losses in income from patient services. Of those agencies reporting a loss from patient services, two had positive EROEs as a result of other and non-operating revenue. Eleven of the agencies were free-standing, seven were hospital-based, and one was based in a home health agency. Four hospital-based agencies reported a profit and only one free-standing agency reported a loss. The home-health based agency reported a profit.

West Virginia Hospices





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Behavioral Health

Ninety-Eight behavioral health providers were required to file financial information with the agency for FY 2007, an increase of seventeen from 2006. The newly added providers are as follows: Alldredge Wilderness Journey, Behavioral Health Solutions, Board of Child Care, Council of the Southern Mountains, Daily Companions, Damous Psychological Services, Family Options Providers, Global Access, Highland Health Center, Home Base, Integrated Resources, Martin Behavioral Health, Mid Valley Health Care, Necco, Solutions Positive Behavior Strategies, Stepping Stones Cottages, and The Greenbrier Academy. One facility, Martin Behavioral Health did not report data for FY 2007 and subsequently closed August 1, 2008. Of the total behavioral health centers operating in FY 2007, thirteen were regional comprehensive centers that provided a full array of services including crisis services; linkages with inpatient and residential treatment facilities; diagnostic and assessment services; provision of support services and treatment services. Other providers specialized in services such as residential treatment; waiver; case management; counseling or combinations of services.

Two facilities experienced name changes in FY 2007, Family Service of Kanawha Valley became Family Counseling Connection and Stars of Appalachia became New Hope Residential Services. One facility, Braley and Thompson was acquired by RSCR, West Virginia in May 2007. Another facility, Deaf Education and Advocacy Focus of West Virginia ceased operation in March 2007. Finally, eight methadone treatment centers were operational in West Virginia in FY 2007. The data for these centers are discussed independently.

Combined profits of \$15.1 million (2.9% of total revenue) were reported for FY 2007 from the 87 behavioral health facilities. This is an increase of \$8.6 million from the prior year. A review of audited financial statements indicates contributing factors for the increases were higher collections of Medicaid waiver dollars and grant monies. Additionally, total revenue growth outpaced total expense growth by 1.7%. Five facilities comprised 79% of the profit: Children's Home of Wheeling, Pres-tera Center for Mental Health Services, REM West Virginia, RSCR West Virginia and VOCA Corporation of America.

Alldredge Wilderness Journey recorded the largest negative EROE of \$3.3 million (84.3% of total revenue). A goodwill impairment loss of \$2.9 million was responsible for the majority of the loss. Fifty-seven facilities reported profits in FY 2007, an increase of nine from FY 2006. Seven of the nine were newly added providers. Twenty-nine facilities reported profits for the last three consecutive years, including eight regional comprehensive centers, 16 reported losses during two of the last three years and 11 reported losses for all three years.

Methadone Treatment Centers:

Eight methadone treatment facilities operated in the state in FY 2007. Aggregate profits for these centers grew \$383,000 to \$6.1 million (29.7% of total revenue) in FY 2007. Profit in FY 2006 was \$5.7 million (27.6% of total revenue). While all centers recorded profits, Charleston Treatment Center was the only provider to experience a decline of \$129,000 from FY 2006. Beckley Treatment Center showed the largest gain of \$160,000. Huntington Treatment Center reported the second largest gain of \$129,000. Clarksburg recorded the smallest increase of \$23,000. The aggregate profit totaled \$6.1 million, 29.7% of total revenue of \$20.6 million. The remaining four facilities reported profits ranging from \$41,000 at Martinsburg Institute to \$56,000 at Parkersburg Treatment Center and Wheeling Treatment Center.

West Virginia Behavioral Health Centers and Methadone Treatment Centers



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Ambulatory Surgery Centers

Ambulatory surgical centers (ASCs) are distinct entities that provide surgical services to patients not requiring a hospital admission. There are 11 certified ASCs in West Virginia, all of which are for-profit facilities. Total Revenue for FY 2007 was \$23.99 million, an increase of \$67,000 over FY 2006. Expenses equaled \$18.8 million, an increase of \$958,000. The overall margin (profit as a percent of total revenue) was 21.7%, the same as FY 2006. For FY 2007, five facilities experienced profits; four had a loss and the remaining center had a zero margin. Tables 27 and 28 show ambulatory surgical center financial and utilization data.

West Virginia Ambulatory Surgery Centers



Glossary of Key Terms

Accounts Payable: Amounts owed to others for goods, services, and supplies purchased and received, but not yet paid for as of the balance sheet date.

Accumulated Depreciation: Amount charged to expense through the annual amortization of the cost of the property, plant, and equipment.

Bad Debt: Amount not recoverable from a patient following exhaustion of all collection efforts.

Capital Lease Obligations: Consists of a portion of the long-term debt obligations incurred for leased items such as equipment and other long-lived assets when leases meet criteria necessary for being capitalized.

Cash: Money in the bank available for immediate expenditure. This may include cash equivalents which are financial instruments that may be readily and quickly converted into cash.

Charity Care: Uncompensated care given by a health care facility to indigent and medically-indigent people as part of a written mission or charity care policy. It does not include accounts written off as "bad debts" or thirty-party adjustments, including those for Medicare and Medicaid. This represents health care services accounted for on the accrual basis which were provided, but were never expected to result in cash inflows.

Contractual Allowance: Accounting adjustment to reflect uncollectable differences between established charges for services rendered to insured persons and rates payable for those services under contracts with third-party payors. The amount of the discount from total charges negotiated by the health care provider with an insurer for the provision of health care services. Or, the difference between total charges and the reimbursement allowed by a governmental payor.

Critical Access Hospital: A Critical Access Hospital is a rural acute care hospital with no more than 25 licensed beds consisting of acute care beds and/or swing beds. The average length of stay must not exceed 96 hours. The Critical Access Hospital will have emergency services available 24 hours and will have agreements, contracts or affiliations for transfer and services.

Current Maturities of Long Term Debt: Amounts payable on bonds, mortgage loans, capital lease obligations, and other long-term debts to be paid in the next 12 months.

Diagnosis-related Groups (DRGs): Classifications in a system to group patients by diagnosis, type of treatment, age, and other relevant factors. Hospitals are paid a set fee for treatment of patients in each DRG category regardless of resource utilization (within limits) under this prospective payment system.

Diagnosis-related Group (DRG) Case Weight: Measure of the relative average expected resource utilization or costliness of patient care in a particular DRG in comparison to the average costliness of all DRGs. A case weight of 1.0000 is given to a DRG with expected resource consumption equal to that of the average of all DRGs.

Employment Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA) of 1974: A federal law which established rules for pension and retirement plans, which excluded states from regulating these plans. The majority of health plans in the US are covered by ERISA, and therefore exempted from certain regulations. Only federal courts have jurisdiction for lawsuits against ERISA covered plans.

Excess Revenue (Deficit) Over Expenses (EROE): Bottom line measure of residual income or (loss) that is generated from the aggregate revenues, expenses, gains, and losses of the facility due to the overall activities of the facility.

Fund Balance and/or Equity: Consists of tax-exempt corporation fund balances and proprietary corporation owner's equity including capital invested and retained earnings.

Gross Patient Revenue (GPR): Amount charged by the facility for services provided to patients. It is the standard charge made by the facility before discount and contractual allowances.

Income (Loss) from Patient Services: Equals net patient revenue less operating expenses. Net patient revenue only includes payments for patient services rendered, it does not include other operating or non-operating revenues.

Inventory: Cost of supply items on hand that will be used in the next period. It may consist of medical supplies, surgical supplies, pharmaceutical supplies, food, and other supplies.

Long Term Acute Care Hospital (LTCH): Acute care hospital that provides care for patients who have been in an intensive care or short-term care setting and who require an extended length of stay (greater than 25 days). LTCHs are often referred to as a “hospital within a hospital”.

Long-term Debt: Consists of notes payable to banks, revenue bonds payable, and, in some cases, capital lease obligations due to be paid at a date more than one year in the future.

Major Diagnosis Category (MDC): Grouping of DRGs in a higher category of medically related system classifications.

Margin: The percentage of revenue or net income that has been realized after expenses.

Medicare Severity Diagnosis Related Groups (MS-DRG): Classification system which groups inpatient discharges by principal and secondary diagnosis. System became effective as of 10/1/07 replacing the DRG classification system.

Net Patient Receivables: Amounts owed by patients less contractual adjustments and estimated allowances for bad debt.

Net Patient Revenue (NPR): Amount the facility receives or expects to receive from patients and/or third-party payors for the services provided by the facility less contractual adjustments, and allowances for Charity Care and Bad Debt.

Net Property, Plant, and Equipment: Remaining book value of physical assets such as buildings and equipment after subtracting accumulated depreciation.

Non-operating Revenue: Amounts the facility receives from items that are neither directly nor indirectly the result of treating patients or other operating activity. Examples of revenue in this category are investment income and donations.

Other Assets: Items not expected to be expended in the current period. These consist of items such as funds held for bond indenture requirements, investments for self-insured

malpractice, and hospitalization programs. Assets with limited use due to restrictions.

Other Current Assets: Items expected to be expended during the current period. These consist of items such as short-term investments and current portion of assets.

Other Current Liabilities: Accrued expenses for wages and salaries, benefits, and interest.

Other Liabilities: Consists of items such as liabilities for self-insured malpractice, employee benefit programs (pension and health care), and inter-company payables for affiliated facilities.

Other Operating Revenue: Amount the facility receives from sales of items not directly resulting from treating patients. It includes items such as cafeteria sales and the sale of copies of medical records.

Other Receivables: Receivables from revenue sources other than patients. The receivable may consist of settlement amounts due from Medicare, Medicaid, or from other parties.

Payer: The person, government body, or public or private organization that is responsible for payment of health care expenses. Payors include insurance companies and self-insured employers.

Pre-tax Income: Revenues minus expenses before income tax, and may also exclude extraordinary items.

Prepaid Expenses: Amounts already paid for the cost of items that will be expended in the current period. The prepaid expenses may consist of items such as prepaid insurance.

Property, Plant, and Equipment: Historical cost of land, buildings, and equipment owned by the facility. It may also include capital leases, which are leases for the approximate life of the asset.

Swing Bed: Beds certified by Medicare for use in small hospitals as either general medical/surgical or skilled nursing beds with reimbursement based on the specific care provided. Swing beds provide small hospitals with greater flexibility to meet fluctuating demands for inpatient hospital and skilled nursing care.

Total Assets: Total of all assets listed in the balance sheet.

Total Liabilities: Total of all liabilities listed on the balance sheet.

Total Liabilities and Fund Balances and/or Equity:

Summation of the total liabilities and fund balance or equity shown on the balance sheet.

Total Operating Expenses: Amount recorded by the facility for items purchased or accrued as normal operating expenses. It includes, but is not limited to, items such as salaries, employee benefits, medical supplies, utilities, depreciation, interest on debt, income and provider taxes (if applicable), and all other necessary supplies.

Uncompensated Care: Amount of patient care provided without compensation or reimbursement, consisting of Charity Care and Bad Debt.




Data Compilation, Analysis and Publication
