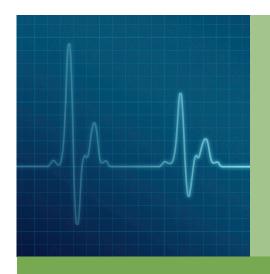

Elective Delivery Quality Collaborative Achieves Goal

Nine months is the magic time--for the healthiest start in life for West Virginia's babies and for the *Elective Delivery Quality Collaborative* to reduce the number of medically unnecessary preterm deliveries. Such pre-term births are not supported by the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

"West Virginia, like the rest of the country, is seeing a rise in the numbers of babies that are delivered at less that 39 weeks without documented medical risk factors for the mother or for the baby," explained Sonia Chambers. "These births can put both mothers

and babies at increased risk on many levels. We set out to change this trend In West Virginia."



The Collaborative partnered with fifteen hospitals which represent 70 percent of the births in the state. Using a proven methodology developed by the Institute for Healthcare Improvement, the Collaborative:

- · Used evidence-based change packages that facilitated easy to implement opportunities for improvement;
- Structured monthly reporting on a common core set of measures;
- Provided technical assistance from expert faculty and subject matter sources;
- · Incorporated Web-based technology for communication and shared learning; and
- Offered teleconference and in-person learning options to accelerate learning and the adoption of change.

"To date, the goal of reducing preterm elective births that was achieved by the Collaborative appears to be holding," continued Chambers. "Through the dedication and hard work of all our partners, we are improving the health of mothers and babies as well as reducing costs."



The rate of elective pre-term deliveries, performed without documented medical necessity, decreased from more than 21 percent of total births in January 2009 to 8.5 percent in August 2009.

Reduction rate pertains to the fifteen participating West Virginia hospitals.

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FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Hospitals

Overall, the profitability of West Virginia hospitals decreased in FY 2008. Profits of \$85.5 million or 1.9% of net patient revenue (NPR) were reported, down from \$185.5 million (4.4% of NPR) in FY 2007.

Global economic conditions in 2008 significantly impacted certain hospitals with large financial investments, especially investments such as derivative agreements. Additionally, accounting standards are in a transitional period which is affecting the recording of market fluctuations on investment instruments. Therefore, gains and losses as presented by the statement of operations may no longer reflect the basic operations of the entity during times of dramatic market changes.

The West Virginia Health Care Authority has determined that its purpose should be to emphasize the operations of the entity over financial market fluctuations. As such, the profits and losses presented within this report are exclusive of these market changes except where they are specifically addressed.

Acute Care Hospitals

The total profit margin for the 34 general acute care hospitals decreased by almost 3%, with profits of \$67.4 million (1.7% of

NPR), down from \$171.3 million (4.5% of NPR) in the prior year.

Critical Access Hospitals (CAH)

As a group, the profitability for CAHs decreased after four straight years of improvement. The aggregate profit was \$789,000 (0.3% of NPR, down from \$5.8 million (2.3% of NPR) in FY 2007. In FY 2006, profit was \$4.3 million (1.8% of NPR).

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals (LTCH)

The two facilities in FY 2008 reported a profit of \$2.6 million (9.5% of NPR), an increase over the FY 2007 profit of \$1.5 million (5.9% of NPR).

Psychiatric Hospitals

The psychiatric hospitals had an aggregate loss of \$3.0 million (9.9% of NPR), with the two state psychiatric hospitals losing \$4.0 million combined and the two private hospitals earning profits of \$1.0 million. The prior year's overall loss was \$8.3 million (35.8% of NPR).

Rehabilitation Hospitals

The five rehabilitation hospitals reported aggregate profits of \$17.8 million (19.3% of NPR). In FY 2007, aggregate profits were \$19.8 million (22.1% of NPR).

Other Facilities

Nursing Homes

The overall profit margin for the state's 106 nursing homes increased by 0.9%. Aggregate profits of \$53.9 million (7.4% of NPR) were reported, an increase over the \$44.8 million (6.5% of NPR) reported in FY 2007.

The increase in profits for the nursing homes in FY 2008 is entirely due to the sale of two nursing homes, which recorded combined gains on sale of assets of \$14.8 million. Without these sales aggregate profits fell by \$6.2 million.

Aggregate NPR increased \$45.5 million in FY 2008; expenses increased \$51.5 million.

Home Health

Overall, home health agencies reported total losses of \$579,000 on \$99.7 million total revenue; 32 of the 63 agencies were profitable.

Five home health agencies were acquired during FY 2008, down from 11 acquired in FY 2007.

Hospice

Hospice profits for the 21 agencies were \$449,000, compared to \$8.3 million in FY 2007.

Total revenue increased by \$9.5 million; while expenses increased by \$16.3 million.

Behavioral Health Facilities

Ninety behavioral health providers reported aggregate profits of \$14.9 million, 2.7% of total revenue; 49 of 90 facilities were profitable.

Methadone Treatment Facilities

The aggregate profit for the eight facilities was \$6.6 million, 32.8% of total revenue.

A ninth treatment facility opened at the end of FY 2008.

Renal Dialysis Centers

Twenty-three renal dialysis centers reported an aggregate profit of \$21.4 million, 26.2% of total revenue.

A twenty-fourth dialysis center opened late in FY 2008.

Ambulatory Surgical Centers (ASC)

Eleven reporting certified ASCs had an aggregate profit of \$5.7 million, 22.4% of total revenue.

OVERVIEW OF KEY INDICATORS

The West Virginia Health Care Authority (Authority) collects and disseminates financial data on health care facilities, including hospitals, nursing homes, home health agencies, hospice agencies, behavioral health centers, renal dialysis centers and ambulatory surgical centers. The reporting period is the facility fiscal year which ended during the calendar year. Therefore, the data are reflective of a time span rather than of one point in time. The data are presented here as reported by the

facilities. While the manner and type of information submitted varies with the type of facility, efforts have been made to produce reasonable comparisons. Where the number of facilities has changed since the previous year, a "same-facilities" comparison is often used.

This report includes information related to 389 health care providers operating in West Virginia in FY 2008.

Total Revenue

The facilities included in this report had aggregate revenue of \$6.2 billion from patient services along with other operating and non-operating revenue. This is the first year renal dialysis centers have been included in the annual report. Total revenue for the dialysis centers equaled \$82.0 million. Excluding the renal dialysis revenue, there was an increase in total

revenue of \$244 million (4.1%) over FY 2007.

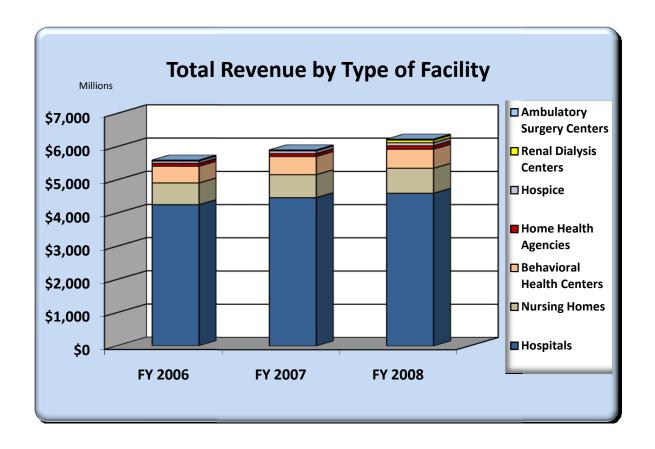
General acute care hospitals accounted for \$109 million (44.8%) of the growth in revenue. Nursing homes and behavioral health centers provided another \$61.1 million (25%) and \$25.4 million (10.4%), respectively, of the total increase in revenue.

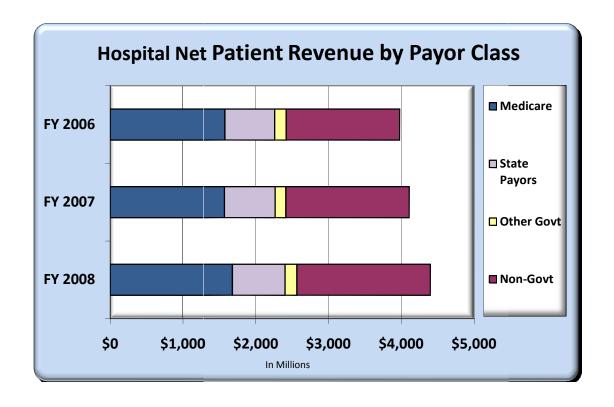
Net Patient Revenue

Net patient revenue (NPR), the amount received for patient services, is also reported by payor categories for hospitals and nursing homes.

For hospitals in FY 2008, nongovernmental payors (commercial, Blue Cross Blue Shield, Carelink, unions, ERISAs, self-pay) provided the largest amount of revenue of \$1.8

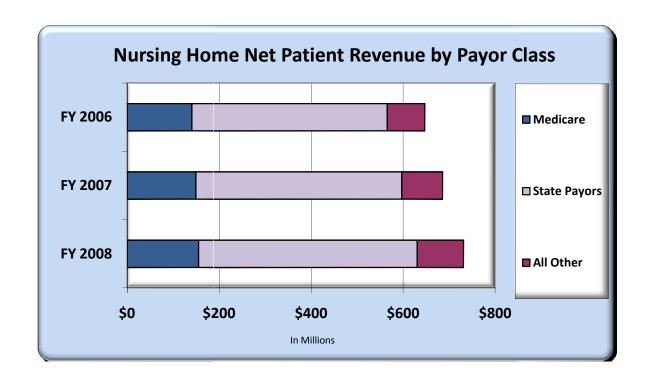
billion, closely followed by Medicare of \$1.7 billion. State payors (Medicaid, PEIA) and other governmental payors (VA, Worker's Comp, etc.) combined provided revenue of \$887 million.

Total net patient revenue for all payors equaled \$4.4 billion, an increase of 5.5% over the prior year.



For nursing homes, Medicare and Medicaid revenue equaled \$155 million and \$475 million, respectively. Revenue from other

payors combined was \$101 million. Total net patient revenue was \$731 million, an increase of 6.6% over FY 2007.



Excess Revenue (Deficit) Over Expenses (EROE)

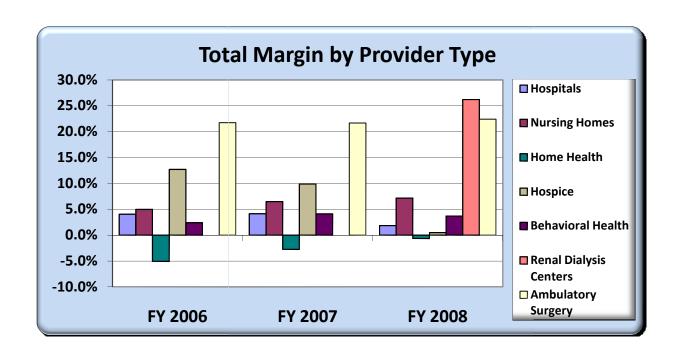
Aggregate profits for all facilities were \$167 million (excluding renal dialysis centers), down 36.8% from FY 2007. The term profit (loss) is used here interchangeably with excess (deficit) of revenue before taxes and extraordinary items (EROE), and is applied to all facilities, including not-for-profits. Hospitals, behavioral health centers, and hospice agencies had decreased profits.

Nursing homes and ambulatory surgery centers experienced increased profits, while home health agencies had a reduction in losses.

Together, hospitals and nursing homes accounted for 85.9% of the total revenue and 74.2% of the total profit.

Utilization

Hospital inpatient utilization showed little fluctuation for several years, but over the past three years total inpatient discharges have decreased by 12,079 (4.1%). In FY 2008 the decrease continued with 5,856 (2.0%) fewer discharges than in FY 2007. In FY 2007 discharges decreased by 1,151 (0.4%) and in FY 2006 there was a decrease of 5,072 (1.7%).

The three-year decline in Medicare discharges of 8,202 (5.6%) accounts for 68% of the total decline. Nongovernmental discharges decreased by 2,056 (2.8%) over the same period accounting for 17% of the decline.

While the exact cause of the decline cannot be determined, a few factors that may have impacted this include:

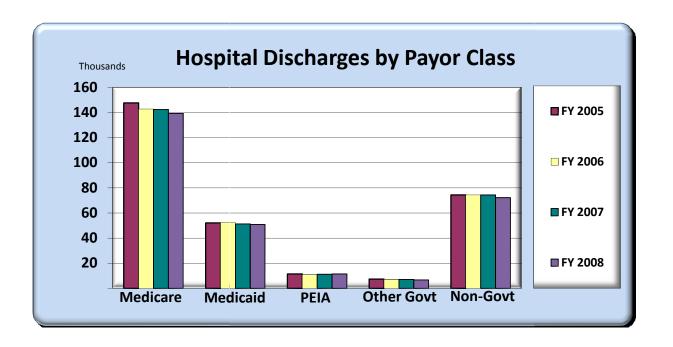
- a decrease in the number of cardiac related discharges;
- continued growth in outpatient treatments; and,
- a drop in the number of hospitals from 66 in FY 2005 to 63 in FY 2008.

However, it is impossible to say whether those patients that would have been admitted to a closed hospital were seen in another hospital within the state or whether they were treated in an outpatient setting instead.

Discharges covered by nongovernmental payors accounted for 25.7% of total discharges, and approximately 30% of inpatient revenue. Medicare was the largest payor, with 49.6% of the discharges, and 48% of the inpatient revenue. The remaining

24.7% of discharges were covered by Medicaid, PEIA and other governmental payors, and generated 22% of inpatient revenue.

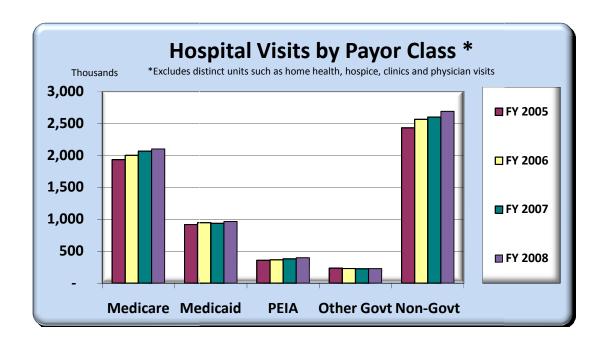


Utilization of hospital outpatient services continues to grow, although inpatient revenues remain the larger portion of total revenue. There were nearly 6.4 million outpatient visits in FY 2008, an increase of 176,000 (2.8%). Over three years, outpatient visits have risen by 506,000 (8.6%).

The payor mix is substantially different for outpatient services compared to inpatient services. Whereas Medicare dominates the inpatient utilization, the nongovernmental payor class is the largest category with 42.2% of visits, followed by Medicare with 32.9%, and Medicaid with 15.1%.

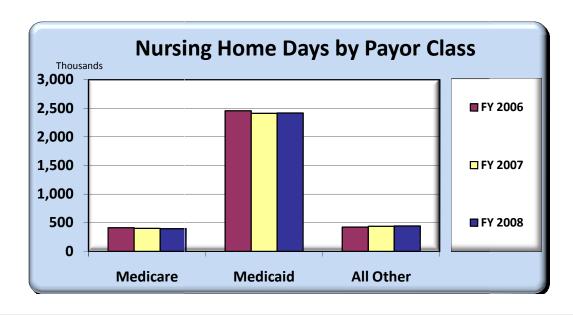

Nursing home utilization remains stable with a slight increase of 0.2% in total patient days between FY 2007 and FY 2008. There were 10,068 licensed nursing home beds reported statewide for FY 2008. Total patient days of 3.3 million equaled an occupancy rate of 88.7%.

Governmental programs pay for the vast majority of nursing home services; Medicare and Medicaid provide 86.4% of patient days. Medicaid, with 2.4 million inpatient days (74.1%), is by far the largest payor; Medicare days equal 398,000 (12.2%). Medicare covers only skilled nursing services.

Nursing homes may offer some outpatient services, such as physical therapy to discharged patients, but the level of utilization has been minimal.



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HOSPITALS

The FY 2008 economic status of West Virginia's hospitals is presented according to their respective service type, which includes:

- general acute care hospitals 34 facilities
- critical access hospitals 18 facilities
- long-term acute care hospitals 2 facilities
- psychiatric hospitals 4 facilities
- rehabilitation hospitals 5 facilities.

The mix of services provided by each hospital grouping varies to the extent that each one should be presented independently of the others. The data tables that follow the narrative section begin with general acute care hospital statistics and then move into numbers for all facility types.

As a group, West Virginia's 63 hospitals reported a decrease in profitability in FY 2008. Profit (loss) is used here to mean excess (deficit) of revenue over expenses (EROE) prior to:

- taxes,
- any extraordinary gains or losses, and
- certain changes in market values of investments.

EROE is used for not-for-profit as well as for-profit hospitals.

- Total profit for FY 2008 was \$85.6 million, or 1.9% of net patient revenue (NPR).
- This was a reversal of a two-year upswing in profits in FYs 2007 and 2006.
- The profit in FY 2007 was \$190.1 million (4.6% of NPR) and \$177.6 million (4.5% of NPR) in FY 2006.

Detailed information on aggregate and individual hospital income as well as utilization is shown in Tables 6-19.

Special Items of Note for FY 2008

The problems in the financial markets during FY 2008 have significantly affected multiple hospitals within the state. The condition of the financial markets, plus ongoing changes in accounting standards, necessitated a modification in reporting investment income and losses in the Uniform Financial Report (UFR), which is the hospital data source for this report. This change in reporting, while applicable to all hospitals, is occurring only with those larger

hospitals, or members of hospital systems, that have derivative agreements and/or have adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standard (SFAS) 159.

The impact of extreme market fluctuations that can occur with derivative investment instruments and certain accounting standards should not be included in those areas of the UFR that are utilized by the Health Care Authority in its rate setting and reporting functions. The impact of these changes is now included only within the profit or loss, after tax and after extraordinary items. The profits and losses displayed in the WVHCA FY 2008 annual report tables are pre-tax and pre-extraordinary items; as such, changes in the market value of derivatives and other investments related to the adoption of SFAS 159 are not included within the FY 2008 tables.

Only the FY 2008 data has been adjusted. The impact to FY 2007 data from these factors, however, is negligible. The market fluctuations as related to specific hospitals are discussed below.

During FY 2008 Richwood Area Community Hospital closed. Because of the closure of Guyan Valley and WV Rehabilitation Center (in FY 2006), St. Luke's (in FY 2007), and Richwood, samefacilities comparisons are made in total and for those categories when comparing data with prior years. Unless otherwise indicated, this narrative uses the same-facilities comparisons.

General Acute Care Hospitals

These hospitals primarily provide short-stay medical-surgical services, although they may include units providing a wide range of other services. There were 34 general acute care hospitals in FY 2008.

Financial items of note regarding the general acute care hospitals included:

- Profits from acute care hospitals were down \$103.9 million, decreasing from \$171.3 million (4.5% of NPR) in FY 2007 to \$67.4 million (1.7% of NPR) in FY 2008.
- Reduced profitability in FY 2008 resulted from an \$80.0 million decrease in other revenue and an increase in the loss on patient services of \$23.9 million.
- Sixty percent (\$62.5 million) of the decrease in other revenue came from three hospitals: WVU and Monongalia General had decreases in investment income of \$35.4 million, and \$10.5 million, respectively; and Cabell Huntington had a decrease in net assets released from restrictions of \$13.0 million.
- Twenty-three of the 34 acute care hospitals reported a profit for FY 2008. Gains ranged from Wetzel County's \$23,000 (0.10% of NPR) to Greenbrier Valley's \$18.7 million (28.8% of NPR).

- Losses from the 11 remaining hospitals ranged from City Hospital's \$31,000 loss (0.03% of NPR) to Cabell Huntington's loss of \$9.2 million (3.3% of NPR).
- Twenty-three hospitals reported a decrease in their profit/loss picture from FY 2007.
- In FY 2008 four hospitals had margins (profit as a percent of NPR) of 10% or higher. In FY 2007, six hospitals had margins greater than 10%.
- The hospitals with margins greater than 10% in FY 2008 were, in descending order, Charleston Surgical Hospital (32.7%), Greenbrier Valley (28.8%), Raleigh General (12.7%), and Logan Regional (10.0%).
- One hospital (Princeton Memorial) had a margin between 5% and 10%, down from seven hospitals in FY 2007.

The state's largest hospital, Charleston Area Medical Center (CAMC), had a margin of 1.7%. CAMC recorded a \$26 million litigation judgment within its operating expenses for FY 2007, thereby reducing its profit by that amount. During FY 2008, the \$26 million award was reduced. The reduction of the judgment was recorded within the hospital's statement of operations by a decrease in its operating expenses of \$14.3 million. Without this reduction in expenses the hospital's reported profit of \$11.1 million would have resulted in a loss of \$3.2 million for FY 2008.

As discussed in the preceding *Special Items of Note* section, FY 2008 saw significant changes in market forces and new investment instruments that impacted global, national and local enterprises. Changes in accounting standards recently implemented compound the changes in economic forces causing certain market value fluctuations to be included within hospital's statements of operations. These circumstances resulted in significant decreases in profitability of several hospitals in West Virginia that extend beyond the normal profit and losses of standard operations. For example, ten hospitals reported combined losses of \$191.5 million due to market fluctuations of derivative agreements and the adoption of SFAS 159. The Authority requested that this be reported separately so it was not included in the discussion above.

The top three losses from market fluctuations of derivatives and/or the impact of adopting SFAS 159 are:

- WVU Hospitals showing a \$81.3 million loss;
- CAMC showing a \$65.8 million loss; and,
- United Hospital showing a \$32.3 million loss.

These three hospitals account for 93.5% of the market losses reported.

Market losses, such as these, may be reversed with positive economic circumstances and result in significant up-swings in profits. It is the Authority's position that profits and losses from operations should not be obscured by market variations. If these losses were included, the aggregate profit of \$67.4 million for general acute care hospitals would be reduced to a loss of \$124 million.

Patient Services

An important element of the financial status of hospitals is income on patient services.

- Overall, hospitals experienced losses on patient services.
- For FY 2008 aggregate losses of \$70.9 million (1.8% of NPR) were reported compared to \$47.0 million (1.2% of NPR) in FY 2007.
- Twenty-five hospitals reported losses on patient services ranging from \$225,000 (1.0% on NPR) at Wetzel County to \$23.1 million (3.6% of NPR) at CAMC.

A review of the losses on patient services as a percentage of net patient revenue (NPR) reveals:

- Welch Community reported the largest loss on patient services of 154.1% of NPR (\$15.6 million). This decrease, however, reflects a change in reporting subsidies for the state hospitals within other revenue instead of net patient revenue.
- Beckley ARH had the next largest loss of 13.8% of NPR (\$8.3 million).

A review of hospitals with positive incomes on patient services reveals:

- Nine hospitals reported profits on patient services ranging from \$375,000 (1.2% of NPR) at Williamson to \$18.5 million (28.5% of NPR) at Greenbrier Valley.
- For-profit hospitals reported the top four margins on patient care: Greenbrier Valley (28.5%), Charleston Surgical (24.2%), Raleigh General (12.2%) and Logan Regional (9.2%).
- There were four not-for-profit hospitals with positive margins ranging from 0.4% (Wheeling) to 4.5% (Princeton).

Uncompensated care, which reduces net patient revenue, increased from 6.4% of gross patient revenue (GPR) in FY 2007 to 6.5% of GPR in FY 2008. Uncompensated care as a percentage of gross patient revenue has risen slowly (1.0%) over the last six years.

Other Revenues

Other revenues provide a secondary role to patient revenues, but are nevertheless an import component of a hospital's financial status and are often the only source of a positive margin. Other revenues consist of other non-patient operating revenue and non-operating revenues. Key items include:

- The increase in losses on patient services was compounded by a decrease in other revenue of \$80.0 million.
- Twenty-four of the 34 hospitals reported decreases in other revenue with 11 hospitals experiencing decreases greater than \$1 million.
- WVU had the largest decrease of \$37.1 million followed by Cabell Huntington with a \$14.0 million decrease. These decreases were almost entirely due to decreases in investment income and net assets released from restrictions.
- Ten hospitals reported increases in other revenues. There were twelve such hospitals in FY 2007
- Fourteen hospitals, with losses on patient services, reported profits solely because of other revenues. In FY 2007, there were 13 hospitals where this occurred.

Operating Expense

A final component impacting the hospitals' financial picture is operating expense:

- Overall, acute care expenses equaled \$4.1 billion in FY 2008, an increase of 6.0% over FY 2007.
- Expenses increased from FY 2006 to FY 2007 by 5.7%. For FYs 2004, 2005, and 2006 expenses increased 8.0%, 4.6% and 5.7%, respectively.
- For acute care hospitals, employee compensation and benefits increased 3.4% from FY 2007. This is the largest component of total operating expenses (48.8%).

Critical Access Hospitals

Critical Access is a Medicare designation for reimbursing small community hospitals for the provision of limited acute care services in combination with swing-bed and skilled nursing care. In FY 2008, 17 of the 18 operating critical access hospitals reported, and the financial performance results were mixed. Richwood Community Medical Center, which closed in June 2008, did not submit Uniform Financial Reports for FYs 2008 and 2007.

Financial items of note regarding the critical access hospitals included:

- Total profit for FY 2008 was \$789,000 (0.3% of NPR) down from \$5.8 million (2.3% of NPR) in FY 2007 and \$4.3 million (1.8% of NPR) in FY 2006.
- The \$5 million decrease in profits can be traced to a decrease in other revenue of \$2.4 million and a deepening loss from patient services of \$2.7 million.
- Nine critical access hospitals reported profits in FY 2008, down from 11 in FY 2007 and 12 in FY 2006.
- Operating expense increases of \$15.8 million (6.1%) outpaced the \$13.1 million increase (5.2%) in net patient revenue, which resulted in a larger loss on patient services.
- Inpatient utilization grew by 3.9%, as measured by total discharges, accompanying the increased net patient revenue.
- An increase of \$10.4 million (7.3%) in total salaries and benefits combined for all facilities.

Key items related to specific hospitals included:

- Montgomery, Morgan County War, and Sistersville General each reported a reduction in income from patient services of over \$1 million.
- Jefferson Memorial, which is part of the West Virginia University Health System, reported a decrease of \$1.7 million in other revenue, which accounts for 71.5% of the \$2.4 million decrease in other revenue.
- Two hospitals earned more than \$1 million in FY 2008. Plateau Medical and Preston Memorial reported profits of \$2.4 million (9.9% of NPR) and \$1.3 million (7.1% of NPR), respectively.
- Eight hospitals reported losses ranging from \$1.1 million (Summers ARH) to \$12,000 (Broaddus).

- Five hospitals reported income from patient services, ranging from Potomac Valley's \$200,000 (1.3% of NPR) to Plateau Medical's \$2.3 million (9.6% of NPR).
- Losses on patient services ranged from Morgan County War Memorial's \$2,000 (0.01% on NPR) to Minnie Hamilton's \$1.8 million (14.3% of NPR).

As demonstrated by a return to the FY 2005 aggregate profit level of less than \$1 million, challenges remain for critical access hospitals despite higher Medicare reimbursements. These facilities experience the same pressures as general acute care facilities to address manpower shortages while maintaining cost controls.

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals

Long-term Acute Care Hospitals (LTCH) are generally defined as hospitals with an average Medicare inpatient length of stay greater than 25 days. These facilities provide extended care including comprehensive rehabilitation, respiratory therapy, head trauma treatment, and pain management.

Two LTCHs operated in West Virginia in FY 2008. Both facilities are for-profit and privately owned. Select Specialty began providing services during 2001. Originally located within CAMC, Select Specialty moved to St. Francis Hospital during FY 2007. Cornerstone Hospital of Huntington opened in March 2005 and is located within St. Mary's Hospital.

Items of note regarding the financial status of long-term acute care hospitals included:

- Total profit for FY 2008 was \$2.6 million (9.5% of NPR) up from \$1.5 million (5.9% of NPR) in FY 2007. For FY 2006 total profit was \$3.3 million (12.4% of NPR).
- For FY 2008 Cornerstone reported a profit of \$2.9 million (20.9% of NPR). Income from patient services provided 98.9% of Cornerstone's total profits.
- In FY 2007 Cornerstone had a profit of \$1.2 million (10.4% of NPR).
- In FY 2008 Cornerstone's discharges increased 2.7% (8 discharges).
- Select Specialty reported a loss of \$362,000 (2.7% of NPR) with a loss from patient services of \$585,000.
- In FY 2007 Select Specialty reported a profit of \$252,000 (1.9% of NPR). The decrease in profits accompanies a decrease in net patient revenue of 1.6% (\$212,000), and a decrease in discharges of 19.9% (79 discharges).

Select Specialty also experienced significant swings in profitability in prior years which
was attributed, in part, to fluctuating levels of management fees charged by the parent
corporation.

Psychiatric Hospitals

Two private (Highland and River Park) and two state (Mildred M. Bateman and Sharpe) hospitals operate as free-standing psychiatric hospitals in West Virginia. While both the private and state hospitals treat psychiatric patients, they operate very differently. For the most part, private hospitals admit voluntary patients, while state-operated hospitals generally do not. Aggregate losses for the psychiatric facilities as a sector equaled \$3.0 million. There are 485 licensed psychiatric beds in West Virginia, which are almost equally divided between private and state hospitals.

Financial items related to the private psychiatric hospitals included:

- Aggregate profits for FY 2008 of \$1.0 million, which is a decrease from \$1.3 million in the prior year.
- An increase in operating expenses of \$665,000 was matched with an increase in NPR of \$740,000.
- A decrease in other revenue of \$347,000.
- River Park, reported a gain of \$658,000 (3.7% of NPR) down from \$1.0 million (5.9% of NPR) in the prior year, and Highland reported a profit of \$357,000 (3.8% of NPR) up from \$247,000 (2.8% of NPR).
- Only River Park, a for-profit facility has consistently reported profits on patient services for the last seven fiscal years.
- Highland's occupancy rate (44.0%) was the lowest of all four psychiatric hospitals. River Park reported an occupancy rate of 63.8%.

Financial items related to the state psychiatric hospitals included:

- Combined losses of \$4.0 million were reported for FY 2008.
- The loss incurred in FY 2008 was an improvement from the prior year's loss of \$9.6 million, but still below the FY 2006 loss of \$2.5 million.

- Net patient revenue increases of \$6.5 million outpaced increases in operating expense of \$3.7 million.
- Other operating revenue increased by \$2.8 million.
- Mildred Bateman, one of the two state hospitals, reported a loss of \$2.4 million. Sharpe, the other state facility, reported a loss of \$1.6 million.
- Combined deficits of \$61.2 million for patient services were reported. These operating losses were reduced substantially because of state apportionments. The state hospitals operate at full capacity with extremely high levels of uncompensated care.

Rehabilitation Hospitals

In FY 2008 five rehabilitation hospitals operated in West Virginia. All five hospitals are for-profit facilities and four are owned and operated by Health South, Inc. The remaining facility, Peterson Rehabilitation and Geriatric Center, is owned and operated by Guardian Eldercare.

Items of note regarding the financial status of the rehabilitation hospitals included:

- For FY 2008 the rehabilitation hospitals reported an overall profit of \$17.8 million (19.3% of NPR), which is a decrease in profit of \$2.0 million from FY 2007.
- The rehabilitation hospitals' 19.3% profit margin is the highest of all of the hospital categories.
- Income from patient services accounts for 98.2% of the rehabilitation hospitals' profit levels.
- Other revenue for FY 2008 was \$325,000, a decrease of 82.6% from the prior year.

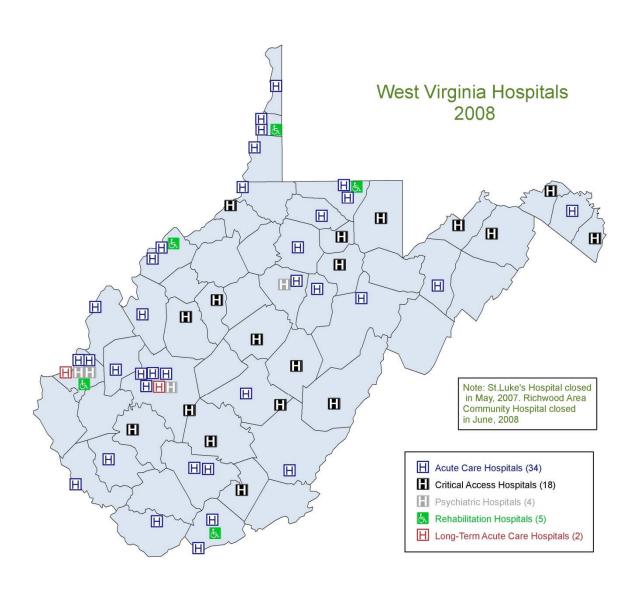

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NURSING HOMES

The FY 2008 Annual Report of Nursing Homes included information from each of the 106 long-term care facilities that operated in the state. The data are provided as reported by the facilities. The largest ownership type, with 85 providers (80.2%), is the for-profit category. Seventy-six facilities are corporations and nine facilities are partnerships. The top four corporate entities that owned or operated nursing homes were:

- Genesis Health Care Corporation (25);
- Integrated Commercial Enterprises (11);
- The Carlyle Group (7); and,
- Sun Health Group (7).

The second largest ownership category included ten not-for-profit corporations. Other ownership categories included three church related providers, two other not-for-profit entities and four state operated nursing homes: Hopemont, John Manchin Sr. Center, Lakin, and Pinecrest Hospital.

Three facilities were sold during the year:

- Morris Memorial Nursing Home was acquired by Diversicare in February 27, 2008. The facility subsequently closed on December 23, 2008.
- Wishing Well Health Care Center and Wishing Well Manor were purchased by Genesis Health Care Corporation on December 31, 2008.

Aggregate utilization of 3.3 million days was reported for FY 2008, and has remained steady around that level since the late 1990s. Medicare and Medicaid accounted for 12.2% and 74.1%, respectively of total days. There were 10,068 licensed nursing home beds in FY 2008.

Financial items of note regarding the nursing homes included:

 Total profits were \$53.9 million (7.4% of NPR), an increase of \$9.0 million over FY 2007.

- Other operating revenue equaled \$21.6 million, an increase of \$15.7 million. This is a reversal from FY 2007 where other operating revenue declined by \$1.5 million.
- The largest component of other operating revenue comes from the sale of two nursing homes. Wishing Well Health Care Center and Wishing Well Manor reported gains on sale of assets, of \$5.5 million and \$9.3 million, respectively.
- Excluding the gains on sale of assets, aggregate profits for FY 2008 fell by \$6.2 million to \$38.7 million.
- Wishing Well Manor experienced the largest EROE, \$10.0 million in FY 2008 compared to \$843,000 in FY 2007. Other operating revenue of \$9.5 million accounted for 95% of the profit.
- Wishing Well Health Care Center recorded the second largest EROE, \$6.1 million. Other operating revenue of \$5.7 million accounted for 92.2% of the profit.
- Excluding the gains on sale of assets, the largest EROE is \$2.3 million, recorded by Sunbridge Pine Lodge & Rehabilitation Center. In FY 2007, the profit for Sunbridge Pine Lodge was \$1.4 million.
- Pinecrest Hospital, one of the state operated facilities, has reported the largest loss for the third consecutive year (approximately \$4.3 million each year).
- Woodlands Retirement Community reported the second largest negative EROE (\$1.7 million). Woodlands also reported similar losses in FYs 2006 and 2007.
- One of the three other state operated facilities, Lakin, reported a positive EROE for the third consecutive year while the remaining two facilities continued to report losses for FY 2008.
- Profitable facilities declined from 88 in FY 2007 to 80 in FY 2008.
- Seventy-two facilities (67.9%) experienced positive EROEs for the last three years while 13 (12.3%) facilities reported losses all three years.

Other elements of the financial situation in FY 2008 included:

• Operating expense increases exceeded net patient revenue increases by \$6.1 million. This was a reversal from FY 2007 when net patient revenue outpaced an increase in operating expense by \$13.5 million.

- Income from patient services was \$34.5 million down from \$40.6 million in the prior year.
- Medicaid expenses of \$34.4 million (8.0%) accounted for 66.8% of the total increase in operating expense in FY 2008.

A review of Medicare and Medicaid services shows:

- In FY 2008 services were provided to Medicare patients by 96 facilities with 85 (88.5%) reporting profits. Income from patient services for Medicare was \$30.5 million. In FY 2007, eighty-nine reported profits.
- In FY 2008 Medicaid services were provided by 104 facilities. Sixty-one (63.5%) reported profits on those services, 11 fewer than in FY 2007. Income from patient services was \$8.8 million.
- As a percent of net patient revenue, the margins for Medicare and Medicaid were 19.6% and 1.9%, respectively.

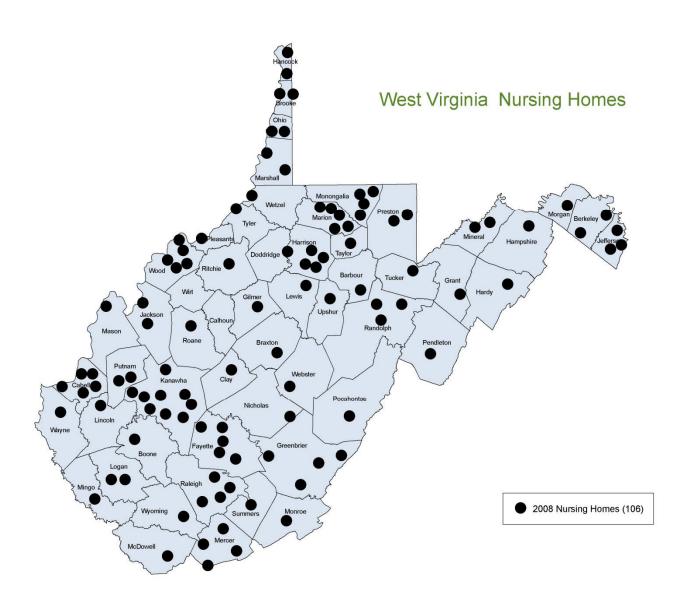

Ownership and Name Changes, Closures, and Facilities reporting less than 12 months of data:

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HOME HEALTH

The FY 2008 Survey of Home Health agencies was completed by 63 of 65 home health agencies that serve West Virginia residents, including those facilities based in Kentucky, Maryland and Ohio. The data are provided as reported by the facilities.

- Overall, home health agencies reported losses of \$579,000, 0.6% of \$99.7 million in total revenue.
- Thirty-two of the 63 agencies were profitable.
- FY 2008 is the sixth consecutive year for aggregate losses.

Losses in previous years included:

- FY 2007- \$2.3 million (2.8% of total revenue);
- FY 2006 \$4.3 million (5.1% of total revenue);
- FY 2005 \$919,000 (1.1% of total revenue); and
- FY 2004 \$1.5 million (1.7% of total revenue).

Analysis of home health agencies by type of ownership shows mixed results. The agencies are subdivided by the following ownership categories:

- County-owned, proprietary and not-for-profit.
- Hospital-based agencies are discussed separately from other agencies, as the structure is significantly different and they historically experience the greatest losses.

There were a few ownership changes during FY 2008:

- LHC Group acquired Care Partners and Mountaineer Home Health; and,
- Amedisys purchased Tender Loving Care Home Health.

These three agencies remain in the proprietary category after the change in ownership. The LHC Group, a publicly traded company, acquired Grant Memorial Hospital Home

Health Services, a not-for-profit hospital-based home health agency, and Jackson County Home Health Service, a county-owned agency. As a result of acquisition, these agencies will move from classification as a not-for-profit to proprietary.

County-owned

Financial items of note regarding county-owned agencies included:

- Two of the nine county-owned agencies were profitable, with an aggregate gain of \$225,000 for FY 2008.
- The remaining seven agencies lost money totaling \$875,000.
- An aggregate loss of \$650,000 (16.3% of \$4.0 million in total revenue).
- Prior year losses of \$366,000 in FY 2007; \$1.3 million in FY 2006; and, \$226,000 in FY 2005.

Proprietary

Financial items related to the proprietary agencies included:

- Total profit of \$6.3 million (9.8% of total revenue) an increase over the FY 2007 profit of \$3.5 million (8% of total revenue).
- Twenty of the 28 proprietary agencies reported profits.
- Prior year results showed profits of \$3.5 million in FY 2007, \$5.1 million in FY 2006, and \$5.4 million in FY 2005.

Not-for-profit

Information regarding the not-for-profit home health agencies revealed:

- Six agencies were operating in FY 2008.
- Three agencies reported combined losses of \$237,000 with total revenue of \$4.1 million.
- Three agencies were profitable, with a combined EROE of \$412,000, 9.6% of \$4.3 million in total revenue.
- Aggregate earnings were \$175,000 on total revenue of \$8.3 million.

Not-for-profit Hospital-based

Items of note regarding the not-for-profit hospital-based agencies showed:

- Continued losses in FY 2008 totaled \$6.8 million.
- Prior years' losses were \$6.5 million in FY 2007; \$8.5 million in FY 2006; and, \$5.5 million in FY 2005.
- The number of agencies having losses in FY 2008 outnumbered profitable agencies 13 to 6.
- Of the six profitable hospital-based agencies, three are based in non-West Virginia hospitals (Kentucky, Maryland and Ohio).
- Beckley ARH Home Health shifted from a not-for-profit, hospital-based agency to a freestanding, not-for-profit.

Proprietary Hospital-based

Three Rivers Home Care is the only proprietary hospital-based agency still operating in West Virginia. Owned by Three Rivers Medical Center in Louisa, Kentucky, the home health agency reported a profit for FY 2008 of \$342,000 (70% of total revenue).

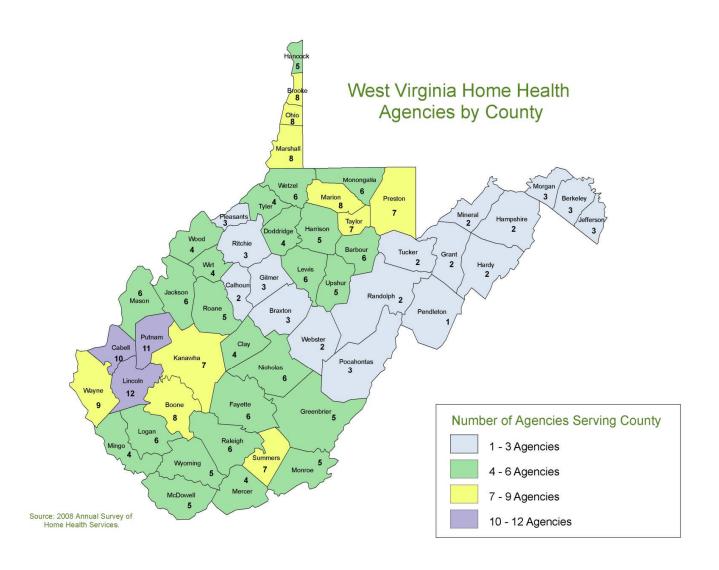

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HOSPICE

The Health Care Authority collected data from 21 West Virginia hospice organizations using the Annual Hospice Survey.

Information submitted for FY 2008 provided the following:

- Net patient revenue was \$88.3 million, an increase of \$9.5 million (12.0%) from the previous year.
- Total hospice profit was \$449,000, or 0.5% of net patient revenue (NPR), a decrease from \$8.3 million, (10.6% of NPR), in FY 2007.
- Expenses increased \$16.3 million (21.6%) from \$75.5 million in FY 2007 to \$91.8 million in FY 2008.
- Income from patient services shifted from a \$3.4 million gain in FY 2007 to a \$3.5 million loss.
- Other and non-operating revenues were \$3.9 million, down from \$4.9 million in FY 2007. Non-operating revenues include contributions from fundraising campaigns and other donations.
- The number of patients served increased by 3.1% and total patient days increased by 9.9%.
- FY 2008 is the second year of declining profits for the West Virginia hospice market. The decrease in profits from FY 2007 to FY 2008 was \$7.9 million; the decrease in profits from FY 2006 to FY 2007 was \$799,000.
- Of the 21 agencies reporting, 13 reported losses in income from patient services.
 Of those agencies reporting a loss from patient services, two had positive EROEs as a result of other and non-operating revenue.
- Thirteen agencies were free-standing, seven were hospital-based, and one was based in a home health agency.
- Three hospital-based agencies, six free-standing agencies, and the home-health based agency reported profits.

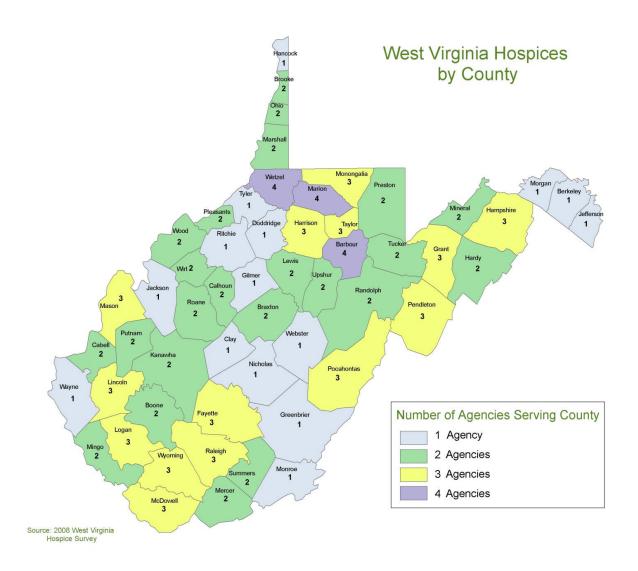

Behavioral Health Facilities Section Table of Contents

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BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Ninety-nine behavioral health providers operated in the state in FY 2008, an increase of one over 2007. For this reporting period, the data are categorized and discussed in three sections.

- Comprehensive Behavioral Health Centers;
- Other Behavioral Health Providers; and
- Methadone Treatment Centers.

Changes in behavioral health providers continued in FY 2008. Two new facilities (Tri-County Behavioral Health and Valley Alliance Treatment Services) began providing services during the year. Three facilities (Alldredge Wilderness Journey, Martin Behavioral Health, and Evergreen Behavioral Health) closed during the year, and one provider (Family Service – Upper Ohio Valley) ceased behavioral health services, opting for providing other social and health services not requiring a behavioral health license.

Two providers experienced operational and name changes during the year.

- The Greenbrier Academy for Girls, formerly known as The Greenbrier Academy was purchased by Relational Management Services in March 2008.
- West Virginia Youth Advocate Program merged with and is now known as The National Youth Advocate Program.

Comprehensive Behavioral Health Centers

These providers offered a full array of services including crisis services; linkages with inpatient and residential treatment facilities; diagnostic and assessment services; provision of support services and treatment services. Thirteen regional comprehensive behavioral health centers operated in FY 2008.

The financial information related to these providers showed:

- A combined profit of \$2.8 million (1.6% of total revenue), an increase of \$323,000 from the prior year.
- Prestera Center and United Summit Center comprised 89.5% of the total profit.
- For the second straight year, Valley HealthCare Systems recorded the largest loss of \$867,000 (6.2% of total revenue). The effect of adoption of SFAS 158

(accounting for pensions) was responsible for the major portion of the \$860,000 loss for FY 2007. For FY 2008, the loss was mainly attributed to an increase in total expenses of \$1.5 million due to increased salaries, wages, benefits, contract labor and professional fee expenses.

 Nine facilities reported profits in FY 2008, one more than was reported for FY 2007. Seven providers indicated profits for the last three consecutive years, two reported losses during two of the last three years and two reported losses for all three years.

Other Behavioral Health Providers

Seventy-seven behavioral health providers offered specialized services in FY 2008. These specialized services included residential treatment, waiver, case management, and counseling, or combinations of services.

The financial condition of these service providers included:

- Aggregate profits of \$12.1 million (3.2% of total revenue), a decrease of \$2.1 million from the prior year.
- Total expense growth of 5.3% outpaced total revenue growth of 4.5%.
- Five providers accounted for 86.7% of the total expense increase of \$18.1 million: Green Acres Regional Center; Coordinating Council for Independent Living; REM Community Options; Starlight Behavioral Health, and VOCA Corporation of America. A review of the financial statements indicates higher program services costs was the major factor for the increase in total expenses.
- The top four profitable centers that earned more than one million dollars were: Coordinating Council for Independent Living; Mid Valley Health Care; RSCR of West Virginia and VOCA Corporation of America.
- Alldredge Wilderness Journey reported the largest loss of \$2.7 million (103% of total revenue). A goodwill impairment loss of \$1.9 million was responsible for the majority of the deficit.
- Forty facilities reported profits for FY 2008, a decrease of twelve from FY 2007.
- Twenty-one providers recorded profits for the last three consecutive years.
 Fourteen facilities reported losses for two of the last three years and eight reported losses for all three years.

Methadone Treatment Centers

Previously, eight licensed methadone treatment centers operated in the state. One additional facility, Valley Alliance Treatment Services, began providing services in December 2008.

Financial items of note for the treatments centers revealed:

- Aggregate profit for FY 2008 was \$6.6 million (32.8% of total revenue of \$20.3 million), an increase of \$548,000 from the prior year. Total profit for FY 2007 was \$6.1 million (29.7% of total revenue of \$20.6 million).
- Total revenues decreased by \$264,000, while total expenses showed a greater decline of \$812,000 from FY 2007. As reflected in the financial statements, the majority of the decrease was attributed to the decline in support services expenses which fell from \$5.2 million in 2007 to \$4.4 million in FY 2008 (14.6%).
- The top three profitable methadone centers that earned more than one million dollars included Huntington Treatment Center, Beckley Treatment Center, and Williamson Treatment Center.

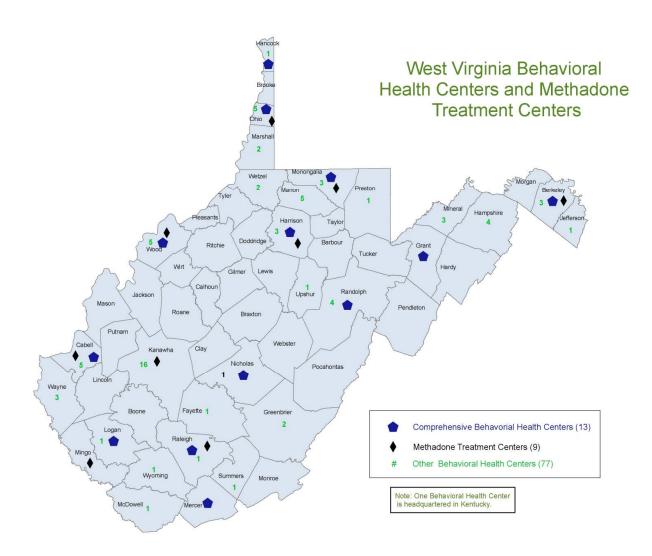

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AMBULATORY SURGERY CENTERS

Ambulatory surgical centers (ASCs) are distinct entities that provide surgical services to patients not requiring a hospital admission.

- Eleven certified ASCs operated in West Virginia during FY 2008.
- All ASCs operated as for-profit entities.
- Total Revenue for FY 2008 was \$25.55 million, an increase of \$1.56 million (6.5%) over FY 2007.
- Expenses equaled \$19.77 million, an increase of \$972,000 (5.2%).
- The overall margin (profit as a percent of total revenue) was 22.4%, an increase from the 21.7% margin for FY 2007.
- Average profit was \$521,000 for FY 2008.
- For FY 2008, eight facilities experienced profits; two had a loss and the remaining center had a zero margin.

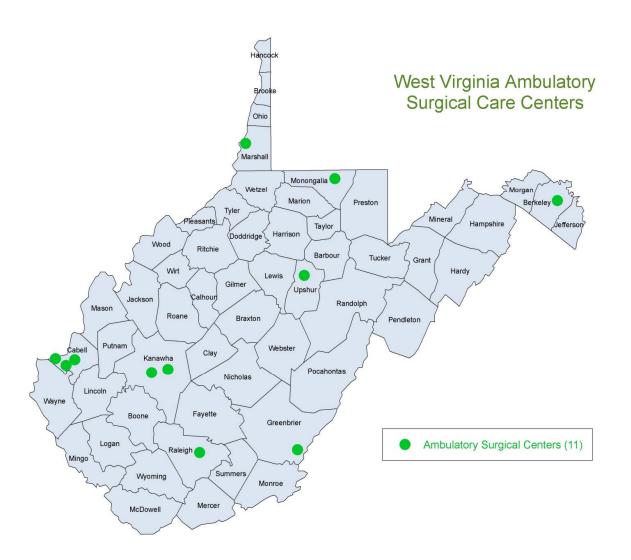

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RENAL DIALYSIS CENTERS

Renal Dialysis Centers are distinct entities that provide treatment for patients in kidney failure using a process of cleansing the blood through a special machine. This is the first year information from renal dialysis centers is included in this report.

- Twenty-four renal dialysis centers operated in West Virginia during FY 2008.
 Twenty-three centers reported financial information for the year. One center opened late in FY 2008 and did not report.
- All dialysis centers are for-profit entities.
- Total revenue for FY 2008 was \$82.0 million, with expenses of \$60.5 million leaving an aggregate profit of \$21.4 million.
- The overall margin (profit as a percent of total revenue) was 26.2%.
- Seventeen facilities reported profits ranging from \$64,000 to \$6.3 million.
 Average profit was \$933,000.

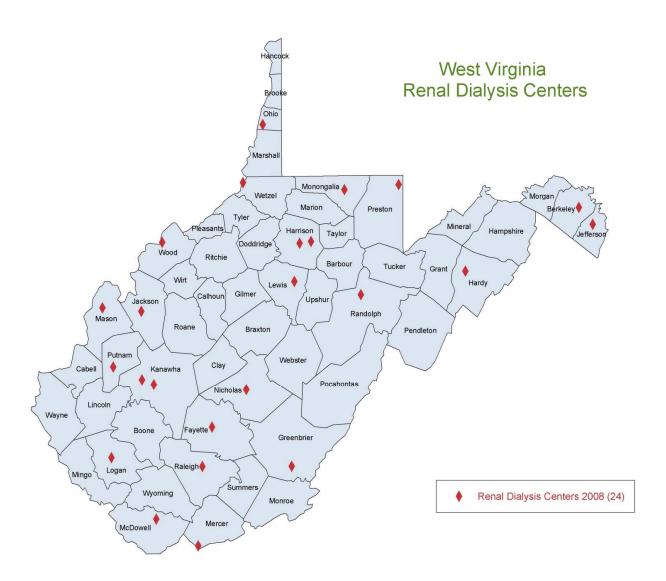

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Accounts Payable: Amounts owed to others for goods, services, and supplies purchased and received, but not yet paid for as of the balance sheet date.

Accumulated Depreciation: Amount charged to expense through the annual amortization of the cost of the property, plant, and equipment.

Bad Debt: Amount not recoverable from a patient following exhaustion of all collection efforts.

Capital Lease Obligations: Consists of a portion of the long-term debt obligations incurred for leased items such as equipment and other long-lived assets when leases meet criteria necessary for being capitalized.

Cash: Money in the bank available for immediate expenditure. This may include cash equivalents which are financial instruments that may be readily and quickly converted into cash.

Charity Care: Uncompensated care given by a health care facility to indigent and medically-indigent people as part of a written mission or charity care policy. It does not include accounts written off as "bad debts" or thirty-party adjustments, including those for Medicare and Medicaid. This represents health care services accounted for on the accrual basis which were provided, but were never expected to result in cash inflows.

Contractual Allowance: Accounting adjustment to reflect uncollectable differences between established charges for services rendered to insured persons and rates payable for those services under contracts with third-party payors. The amount of the discount from total charges negotiated by the health care provider with an insurer for the provision of health care services. Or, the difference between total charges and the reimbursement allowed by a governmental payor.

Critical Access Hospital: Rural acute care hospital with no more than 25 licensed beds consisting of acute care beds and/or swing beds. The average length of stay must not exceed 96 hours. The Critical Access Hospital has emergency services available 24 hours and agreements, contracts or affiliations for transfer and services.

Current Maturities of Long Term Debt: Amounts payable on bonds, mortgage loans, capital lease obligations, and other long-term debts to be paid in the next 12 months.

Derivative Agreement: A financial instrument that is derived from some other asset, index, event, value or condition (known as the underlying asset). Rather than trade or exchange the underlying asset itself, derivative traders enter into an agreement to exchange cash or assets over time based on the underlying asset.

Glossary of Terms (Cont.)

Diagnosis-related Groups (DRGs): Classifications in a system to group patients by diagnosis, type of treatment, age, and other relevant factors. Hospitals are paid a set fee for treatment of patients in each DRG category regardless of resource utilization (within limits) under this prospective payment system.

Diagnosis-related Group (DRG) Case Weight: Measure of the relative average expected resource utilization or costliness of patient care in a particular DRG in comparison to the average costliness of all DRGs. A case weight of 1.0000 is given to a DRG with expected resource consumption equal to that of the average of all DRGs.

Employment Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA) of 1974: A federal law which established rules for pension and retirement plans, which excluded states from regulating these plans. The majority of health plans in the US are covered by ERISA, and therefore exempted from certain regulations. Only federal courts have jurisdiction for lawsuits against ERISA covered plans.

Excess Revenue (Deficit) Over Expenses (EROE): Bottom line measure of residual income or (loss) that is generated from the aggregate revenues, expenses, gains, and losses of the facility due to the overall activities of the facility.

Fund Balance and/or Equity: Consists of tax-exempt corporation fund balances and proprietary corporation owner's equity including capital invested and retained earnings.

Gross Patient Revenue (GPR): Amount charged by the facility for services provided to patients. It is the standard charge made by the facility before discounts and contractual allowances.

Income (Loss) from Patient Services: Equals net patient revenue less operating expenses. Net patient revenue only includes payments for patient services rendered, it does not include other operating or non-operating revenues.

Inventory: Cost of supply items on hand that will be used in the next period. It may consist of medical supplies, surgical supplies, pharmaceutical supplies, food, and other supplies.

Long Term Acute Care Hospital (LTCH): Acute care hospital that provides care for patients who have been in an intensive care or short-term care setting and who require an extended length of stay (greater than 25 days). LTCHs are often referred to as a "hospital within a hospital".

Long-term Debt: Consists of notes payable to banks, revenue bonds payable, and, in some cases, capital lease obligations due to be paid at a date more than one year in the future.

Major Diagnosis Category (MDC): Grouping of DRGs in a higher category of medically related system classifications.

Glossary of Terms (Cont.)

Margin: The percentage of revenue or net income that has been realized after expenses.

Medicare Severity Diagnosis Related Groups (MSDRG): Classification system which groups inpatient discharges by principal and secondary diagnosis. System became effective as of 10/1/07 replacing the DRG classification system.

Net Patient Receivables: Amounts owed by patients less contractual adjustments and estimated allowances for bad debt.

Net Patient Revenue (NPR): Amount the facility receives or expects to receive from patients and/or third-party payors for the services provided by the facility less contractual adjustments, and allowances for Charity Care and Bad Debt.

Net Property, Plant, and Equipment: Remaining book value of physical assets such as buildings and equipment after subtracting accumulated depreciation.

Non-operating Revenue: Amounts the facility receives from items that are neither directly nor indirectly the result of treating patients or other operating activity. Examples of revenue in this category are investment income and donations.

Other Assets: Items not expected to be expended in the current period, but with limited use due to restrictions. These consist of items such as funds held for bond indenture requirements, investments for self-insured malpractice, and hospitalization programs.

Other Current Assets: Items expected to be expended during the current period. These consist of items such as short-term investments and current portion of assets.

Other Current Liabilities: Accrued expenses for wages and salaries, benefits, and interest.

Other Liabilities: Consists of items such as liabilities for self-insured malpractice, employee benefit programs (pension and health care), and inter-company payables for affiliated facilities.

Other Operating Revenue: Amount the facility receives from sales of items not directly resulting from treating patients. It includes items such as cafeteria sales and the sale of copies of medical records.

Other Receivables: Receivables from revenue sources other than patients. The receivable may consist of settlement amounts due from Medicare, Medicaid, or from other parties.

Payor: The person, government body, or public or private organization that is responsible for payment of health care expenses. Payors include insurance companies and self-insured employers.

Glossary of Terms (Cont.)

Pre-tax Income: Revenues minus expenses before income tax, and may also exclude extraordinary items.

Prepaid Expenses: Amounts already paid for the cost of items that will be expended in the current period. The prepaid expenses may consist of items such as prepaid insurance.

Property, Plant, and Equipment: Historical cost of land, buildings, and equipment owned by the facility. It may also include capital leases, which are leases for the approximate life of the asset.

Renal Dialysis: A process that filters the blood, the way kidneys do when functioning normally, using a special machine. The filtration rids the blood of waste products then returns it to the patient through a venous catheter.

SFAS 159: Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) 159, *The Fair Value Option for Financial Assets and Financial Liabilities*. This Statement allows entities to report certain financial instruments at fair value, and avoid employing complex hedge accounting practices.

Swing Bed: Beds certified by Medicare for use in small hospitals as either general medical/surgical or skilled nursing beds with reimbursement based on the specific care provided. Swing beds provide small hospitals with greater flexibility to meet fluctuating demands for inpatient hospital and skilled nursing care.

Total Assets: Total of all assets listed in the balance sheet.

Total Liabilities: Total of all liabilities listed on the balance sheet.

Total Liabilities and Fund Balances and/or Equity: Summation of the total liabilities and fund balance or equity shown on the balance sheet.

Total Operating Expenses: Amount recorded by the facility for items purchased or accrued as normal operating expenses. It includes, but is not limited to, items such as salaries, employee benefits, medical supplies, utilities, depreciation, interest on debt, income and provider taxes (if applicable), and all other necessary supplies.

Uncompensated Care: Amount of patient care provided without compensation or reimbursement, consisting of charity care and bad debt. Contractual allowances are not included.

Infection Control Advisory Panel Tracking Two Key Indicators

The *West Virginia Healthcare Associated Infection Control Advisory Panel* began its work in January 2009 with the task of developing guidelines for the reporting and release of information on infections that are acquired among patients admitted to the hospital. The Advisory Panel selected two indicators that must be reported by West Virginia hospitals: certain blood stream infections and flu vaccinations.



Central line-associated blood stream infections (CLABSIs) refer to a general category of primary bloodstream infections that are associated with the presence of a vascular infusion device (central line) that ends at or close to the heart or in one of the great vessels such as the aorta. These infections can often be prevented when health care personnel adhere to established guidelines for the insertion of central lines.

Seasonal flu vaccinations among staff who are directly employed by WV hospitals must be reported to the Advisory Panel. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention state that people infected with influenza virus, including those with subclinical infection, can transmit it to persons at higher risk for complications from influenza. Employee vaccination is associated with fewer deaths among nursing home residents and elderly hospital patients.



It is estimated that between 250,000 to 500,000 CLABSIs occur in U.S. hospitals each year, causing serious complications including longer in-patient days, increased costs, and higher risk of death.

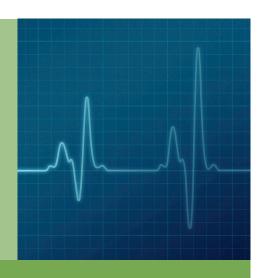

The Authority will ensure that health care associated infections are reported in concert with the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Healthcare Safety Network. Reporting began on July 1, 2009.
